# COMMANDER'S CORNER—Ken Kasprzak



Our Memorial Day Ceremony planning has commenced. As I described last month, our goal is to focus this day and program in honor of veterans who died serving our country. I'm working on an address which will give my thoughts on the importance of Memorial Day.

As a reminder the Germantown American Legion Post 1 will host the Vietnam Moving Wall from Sept. 1-5, Labor Day weekend.

**MEMORIAL BRICK UPDATE.** On April 4, our engraved brick order was placed at giftbricks.com. Proofs were approved and our order is in production as follows:

#### GOOD OF THE LEGION.

- Membership. As last reported, we are at 304 paid members. All of us have a responsibility to promote membership within the legion family. Our Post is at 81% membership renewals. This number could be improved if we work together and encourage our members to pay their 2016 dues. Wisconsin has 1500 less members than last year and Ozaukee County is 765 short but have 199 new members. Within the 2nd District, Ozaukee County is in 2nd place at 92.71% member renewals. As a reminder, the 2nd District Spring Conference on April 30 will be held in Sheboygan. Anyone interested in attending give me a call.
- The 48th Session of the Ozaukee County Youth in Government Day was again successful. A total of 80 students attended and 15 of those were from Grafton High School.

- Flag Day and Parade is scheduled for Sunday, June 12 in Waubeka at the Americanism Center. Our Post is encouraged to participate. See Mike Knoppa with questions and interest.
- Elections of Officers for year beginning July 1 will take place at our May meeting. A slate was approved but nominations will be accepted at this meeting.
- Our Post's Bingo on April 12, we held a food drive to benefit the Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative. Neal Traxel was very thankful to our bingo participants for a very successful food collection. We plan to continue this event again in the future.
- At our May meeting, we plan to honor 8th grade students and family. Students will represent four schools; St. John's, St. Paul's, John Long, and Savior Lutheran.

**The Rand Corporation** has released the results of a study focused on how the U.S. military is treating PTSD and depression among its personnel. Among the conclusions are notably the following:

1. Service members with PTSD have complex service needs.

2. Improvement in psychotherapy is needed. Medication management is continuing to improve.

3. Administrative database quality measures are good but some areas need improvement.

**Chaplain Report:** Les Williams reported that Post member George Mayer has died along with Jim Boehnlein's wife. Jim is now at LaSata. Gerald Koch is scheduled for cancer surgery. Claude Wollner is hanging in there.

**Publicity:** Ron Kuta reported: It was noted the wonderful spread the News Graphic provided on the Post Coloring and Essay Contest

**Americanism:** Bill Clayton reported: The letters to schools in the area for selection of outstanding 8th graders have been sent.

**Scouts:** Steve Shock reported: There was discussion of how to handle a trailer donation issue. It was decided to have the trailer come through the Post to the scouts thus legalizing it.

POW/MIA: Jim Stencel reported: The POW/
MIA Accounting Agency announced the identification of remains of one sailor and two soldiers who had been missing from WWII. Navy Ensign, Lewis
Stockdale who had been assigned to the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor when it was sunk on December 7, 1941. The sinking resulted in 429 casualties including Stockdale. Thirty-five sailors would be subsequently recovered and identified: the remainder would eventually be buried as unknowns in the national Cemetery of the Pacific, better known as the Punchbowl. Jim further reported on the recovery and identification of the remains of numerous WWII, Korea, and Vietnam casualties.

**Camp American Legion:** Dick Lallensack reported: Our cabin is in need of bedding, and a motion to purchase such new bedding from the general fund was tendered and seconded and passed.


