LIVING WELL.....STROKE EDUCATION.

A stroke occurs when blood supply and oxygen is cut off from the brain. Stroke is the fourth leading cause of death and the leading cause of disability in the U.S. A stroke can happen to anyone at anytime. Types of Strokes:

ISCHEMIC---arteries blocked by blood clots. TIA---mini stroke cause by a temporary clot. HEMORRHAGIC---blood vessel bursts and leaks blood.

MANY RISK FACTORS.

Age---Risk doubles for each decade of life after age 55; Family History; Heart Disease; Diabetes, Obesity; High cholesterol; High blood pressure; Smoking; Prior mini stroke.

WARNING SIGNS.

Sudden confusion or trouble understanding. Sudden numbness/weakness of leg, arm, face. Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes. Sudden severe headache with no known cause. Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination. CALL 911.
