#### Meet our newest Post member,

Joseph Emmons Smith was an Ensign with the U.S. Navy, 9th Naval District. He served aboard the USS PCE ® 850 and specialized in diesel engineering. Joe entered into the service on June 26, 1944. He remembers being in the Tokyo Harbor at the signing of the Japanese surrender and later watching U.S. ships sailing out of the harbor flying "Homeward Bound" banners made out of sheets.

Joe was released into inactive duty on October 7, 1945, and settled in Milwaukee, where he met and married Dorothy Strohm. They moved to Grafton in 1953, where he worked for the EST Company.

He was a Lieutenant with the US Naval Reserve until being discharged in 1954. Joe and Dorothy raised 5 daughters who all attended Grafton Schools.

John made contributions to the community by serving on the Grafton School Board, the Grafton Sewer and Water Commission and Treasurer for St. Paul Lutheran Church. Joe will turn 99 years old this December.
