This year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Tet Offensive, which was launched on January 30, 1968 by more than 80,000 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong. It was one of the largest military campaigns of the Vietnam War. Surprise attacks against South Vietnamese and U.S. Armed Forces occurred throughout South Vietnam. Over 100 cities and towns were affected. It ended on September 23, 1968. An estimated 3,178 Americans were killed. During the Tet Offensive Marine Corps Lance Corporal Marco Francisco Mueller was on a patrol near Khe Sanh that was attacked by North Vietnamese troops. He and his fellow Marines received heavy automatic weapons fire from bunkers and trenches. Corporal Mueller, from Port Washington Wisconsin, was 20 years old and died on May 15. Also, four additional Port Washington Servicemen (PFC Paul Laroy Binder, CPL Jerome Norman Doll, SP4 Lon Paul Gregorash, LCDR James Thomas Kearns) perished during the Vietnam War. These five names are listed on the Vietnam Veterans Wall Memori-

We as Americans are forever grateful to our fallen heroes. I ask each one of you individually to remember this day throughout the entire year and ask that you never hesitate to thank and honor our veterans, for they will never hesitate for you.
