# **Rose-Harms SAL News for May 2017**

**Camp American Legion:** The Wisconsin Department of Veteran Affairs (WDVA) donated \$71,432 to support Camp American Legion.

The Tomahawk Post has acquired 2 Kayaks, which they will be auctioning off over the next couple of months. Monies generated from this activity will be donated to Camp American Legion and designated towards the rebuild of cabin 22. The Tomahawk post does an annual fund raiser for the camp and asks the camp to select the target purpose. Last year their efforts raised \$17,000 which was used to remodel to entrance to the main lodge.

Mother Nature is not helping with almost 2 feet of snow remain and ice on the lake is 30 to 36 inches thick. The clean-up week that includes Trail clean up, Pier installation and other preparations has been pushed back to the week of May 1st or later. The Camp opening is pushed back to the week of May 14th.


