Veterans' Caregivers get \$860 Million

Signed into law on June 6, the *VA MISSION Act* gives benefits to the caregivers of veterans from all eras. The VFW-supported law will save money in the long run and encourage more people to serve as independent caregivers.

FW pushed hard for passage of the VA MISSION Act of 2018. It expands the VA caregiver assistance program to all caregivers of veterans, a provision VFW believes is long overdue.

VFW National Veterans Service Assistant Director of Veterans Health Policy James Moss said including caregivers of veterans who served before the Afghanistan War is an "honorable way" to recognize the sacrifices of caregivers. Moss said some of those caregivers already have been providing that care "for decades."

"Caregiver benefits, like other facets of VA health care, are not entitlements requiring mandatory spending by Congress but rather a discretionary program whose availability is governed year to year by levels of funding," Moss said. "Expansion over the next few years will be an annual budget discussion like other parts of VA health care."

Based on the bill, signed by President

Trump on June 6, the expanded caregiver program will cost \$860 million in fiscal year 2019 — a \$365 million increase from the Trump Administration's request at the beginning of the year.

The VA MISSION Act (Public Law 115-182) expands caregiver benefits, which include a monthly stipend, health insurance, respite care and access to the VA Caregiver Support Program, to caregivers of veterans who served before Sept. 11, 2001. Before the law's enactment, the VA program was only available to post-9/11 veteran caregivers.

VA's caregiver program has two options — one that offers a monthly stipend and one that doesn't.

Through the comprehensive caregiver option, caregivers can be eligible for:

- · Caregiver education and training.
- A monthly stipend.
- Financial assistance, including lodging and travel pay, when traveling with the veteran to receive care.

- · Health care benefits through VA.
- Mental health services and counseling for the caregiver.
- Up to 30 days per year of respite care, which gives caregivers a break.

To see if you are eligible for the program, see the info box below.

Earlier this year, then-VA Secretary David Shulkin said that about 26,000 caregivers already were enrolled in the program. He estimated that the expansion will increase to more than 180,000 caregivers — about seven times the current amount. Moss said these estimates are consistent with VA's effort of "phasing in" newly eligible caregivers.

"VA understands that as the cost of health care and the need for support services increase, there will be a demand for more caregivers to help assist loved ones with their activities of daily living," Moss said.

"Expanding caregiver benefits to other generations will not only engage more caregivers and improve quality of care, but positively impact veterans services in the integrated care settings, as well as identify resources and best practices."

Going forward, VFW's advocacy will continue as a way to ensure the benefits of veteran's caregivers are "adequately supported," Moss said.
