Living Well----Chronic Pain can have no clearly identifiable cause and be accompanied by fatigue, sleep disturbance, decreased appetite, and mood changes. It is pathologic in that it persists beyond the expected time of healing. Short courses of opioids are effective but after the 5 to 7 day mark you enter the realm of heightened risk of addiction. Thus pain research is focused on non-opioid treatment. Look to other forms of treatment such as physical medicine and rehabilitation if you suffer from chronic pain. Print date 10/24/19.


