Chaplain, Ken Kasprzak read a poem from the funeral ceremony of Ken Hansen, a Post member for 43 years.

Membership. Gary Gilstrap reported paid membership at 187 with a goal of 298. Ken will work with Gary to draft a letter asking those unpaid to pay prior to end of year.

Finance. Ralph Beck distributed the Finance report that noted that \$5,900 was for the new walk-in cooler's cooling system.

Hall Report Manager, Al Richards said that rentals have occurred in the upper hall (e.g. Lions Club and Ozaukee Realtors). However, we are limiting rentals and the size of groups according to the Governor's guide lines. Neal Schutte and Kevin Dressel agreed to tend bar.

Al received a quote, \$3,446, from Carroll's Heating to replace downstairs furnace. A motion was made, seconded, vote taken, and new furnace approved.

Public Safety. Sandra Krzewinski has contacted Grafton Fire and Police Chiefs regarding presentation of outstanding Ozaukee County Public Safety awards. Possible publicity via local newspaper.

Scouts. Steve Shock noted that Scout annual fund raisers are underway but with virtual sales procedures in place.

Butch Paegelow discussed 2021 Las Vegas Night. For now, raffle tickets will not be printed. At November Executive Committee meeting discussion will take place regarding raffle ticket distribution and possibly moving Las Vegas Night to April or canceling for 2021.

Tents. At year end, Tom Grabow reported that tent crew worked hard with September rentals totaling \$3,742. Some tent take downs remain for October.

Athletic. Doug Arendt reported that September golf outing had 56 golfers and a good time enjoyed by all. Profit \$900.

Legion Baseball----Dan Harris reviewed decisions for 2021 made via a zoom meeting on October 3. Plans

to start baseball next June are underway. State tournament July 30 through August 3. Grafton has a coach and a team. Funding thus far done by parents. General fundraisers need to be done and volunteers are needed to assist. See Dan if interested.



We will be putting up some of the flags for Veterans Day, like we did for Memorial Day at Veterans park.


Membership renewals are about 50% paid. Reminder that dues are \$25 for 2021.

# Who do you call for Veterans Benefits?





As a Veteran, you have various benefits that you have earned from both the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs (WDVA) and the United States Veterans Administration or more commonly know as just the (VA).

Your Ozaukee County taxes pay for a County Veterans Service Office (CVSO), which is located in the old courthouse in Port Washington. # Veterans' legislation signed into law

Last weekend, the President Trump signed the **Commander John Scott Hannon Act** into law.

Years in the making, the new law gives the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) new authorities to expand its provision of mental health care to more veterans and use new kinds of treatment options. Over the past two years, the bill has expanded to include standalone bills from a number of legislators in both the House and the Senate.

On Tuesday, the President signed another three Veteran bills into law:

- Vet Center Eligibility Expansion Act, to allow reserve component service members to access care at these facilities:
- Veterans' Care Quality Transparency Act, requiring that Government Accountability
   Office to study the VA's suicide prevention and mental health services; and
- Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2020, to provide a COLA for VA disability compensation and dependency and indemnity compensation benefits equal to the Social Security COLA, which is 3.1% for 2021.


