Our November monthly Unit meeting was held on Monday the 16th, with 13 members attending. We met upstairs, where we were better able to practice social distancing. As there will be no Christmas party this year, our December meeting will be held TUESDAY DECEMBER 15TH. We will again meet upstairs. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT MASKS OR FACE SHIELDS ARE REQUIRED AT ALL MEETINGS.

The Poppy Committee reported that the poppy distribution held at Sendik's on Veterans Days was a great success. THANK-YOU to all who helped, and most importantly, to all who contributed.

Membership Chair Lora Linder informs us we presently have 135 members who have either renewed or recently joined our Unit. We've reached 75% of our goal for 2021! VA & R chairman Mel Nowak thanks everyone who contributed items to the Christmas with the Vets 33rd Annual Holiday Show. This was more important than ever this year for hospitalized Vets who are unable to return home for the holidays. Be assured that your gift is making their holiday a little brighter. The Christmas Gift Shop is a program sponsored by the Department of WI and funded by Units and individuals. Hospitalized Vets are given the opportunity to pick out gifts for members of their family. These are then wrapped by volunteers and shipped to the families as a gift FROM THE VETERAN. In past years we individually contributed items. A few years ago, this process was streamlined to us donating cash which was used for select items from which the Vet could choose. Approval was given at the November meeting to donate \$100.00 to this program.

As announced in an earlier newsletter, our Unit ordered a replacement sign which now correctly reads VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK. We're happy to say it was installed on Veterans Day. The cost was approximately \$1,890.

Our Unit will have a display at the Grafton Library during the month of April. Note that mention of our 75th Anniversary will be included. Project chair Amy Luft asks that anyone having items for display contact her.

As last year's State Bowling Tournament had to be cancelled, we have again been given the opportunity to host it this year. Committee chair Toni Moegenburg reports it's been rescheduled for the weekends of April 10-11 and April 17- 18 at Circle B. Watch for details in upcoming newsletters.

Executive Board Recommendations approved at this meeting were that we take on the Buddy Basket project and that we explore the possibility of adopting Veterans at a local Care Facility. Village Pointe Commons welcomes our involvement with the Veterans at both the Assisted Living and Skilled Care levels. Due to COVID restrictions, at this time our involvement will be limited to sending cards and notes. In the future we anticipate inviting these Vets to the Post for Memorial and Veterans Days, and visiting with them individually at the facility. Watch upcoming newsletters for additional information.

The Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative (MHVI) is an organization which assists Homeless and At-Risk Veterans. They've been in existence for over 12 years, have served over 5,000 Vets, and have assisted them in obtaining/moving into housing. They've also furnished over 2,000 Veterans homes, using donated items such as furniture, cleaning supplies, food and personal items. "Buddy Baskets" is the Auxiliary's term for these baskets of cleaning items, and a project we've voted to take-on.

From the MHVI website, suggested items include the following: All-purpose cleaners, Bleach wipes (Lysol, Clorox, etc.), Lysol spray, Window/Glass cleaner, a roll of paper towels, Cleanser (such as Comet, etc.), Brooms/dust mops, Buckets, Floor (scrub) mops, Floor cleaners, Sponges, Dish soaps, Laundry baskets, Fabric sheets, Toilet bowl cleaners, Toilet bowl brushes, Furniture Polish (such as Pledge, etc.), Toilet paper

Note that Laundry DETERGENT is not listed, as a member has already promised to supply it for each basket Donations of any of these items (or cash to purchase items) would be greatly appreciated. We estimate the cost of an entire basket to be about \$50. While we have some money budgeted for this project, donated items will enable us to make more than 5 baskets.

As the MHVI assists several Vets each month to move into housing, 5 will be gone in no time. Many of these items can be purchased at the Dollar Tree Store while others (broom, mop, bleach wipes, laundry basket, etc.) can be found at Wal-Mart, Target, Costco, Walgreens, or your favorite grocery store, etc. We'd originally planned to do this later in the year, but the MHVI has informed us that donations are down this year due to COVID, that their supply of these items is extremely low, and they can use whatever we can send.

NOTE: THEY'RE ESPECIALLY IN NEED OF BLEACH WIPES (LYSOL, CLOROX, ETC.). Not wanting to ask for donations in December, we ask that you bring any donated items to the January meeting. They'll be packed and delivered later that month. (Of course, items will be gratefully accepted if brought to the December meeting on Tuesday the 15th.) 
