#### Highlights From Our Last Post Meeting

**Chaplain Ken Kasprzak** informed the members: Gift Cards will be distributed to ill and/or shut-in members in lieu of fruit baskets. Ken asked, via email or from the members present, for names of Veterans who could use receiving a gift card.

Post member, Larry Engel is recovering at home from a recent illness. Taps were played for Post members Kenneth Hansen and Robert Van Dyck.

**Membership.** Gary Gilstrap reported that the paid membership is at 243 with a goal of 298. Unpaid members who were notified with a Post letter to renew their membership, thus far we have had 19 members renew. Membership renewal is available online at *legion.org.* 

New member, Robert Mercer, U.S. Navy was welcomed into the Post.

**Finance.** Ralph Beck clarified the Executive Committee Minutes. "The Post has transferred money from the Nicholas Mutual Fund to our general account to pay for GHS scholarships, the new furnace and the Post's insurance". Although the Post has not had much income, bills still need to be paid.

Hall Report. Al Richards reported that all annual December Christmas parties have been canceled. Thank you, Kevin, for after meeting snacks. Renewal of Wisconsin B-Raffle license fee has been paid. Al asked the members to view the gazebo at Veterans Park, that was nicely decorated for Christmas by the Post's Sons of the American Legion.

**Scouts.** The wreaths and popcorn that the scouts were selling are now available for delivery or pickup. Our Post's liaison to the Scouts, Steve Shock, has completed the requested renewal of his Youth Protection Training.

#### Old Business.

- Bingo is hoping to begin again next September, but may have to wait until 2022. Reasons given were that many elderly participants will not come because of the COVID 19 and that the Post needs at least 60 players to break even.
- Butch Paegelow reported that 14,000 raffle tickets for Las Vegas Night have been printed, with winners to be drawn on April 17. We will be distributing 4 packets per Legion Family member at the end of January.

 Doug Arendt and Gary Gilstrap will contact Kelly Reick, at the Grafton High School, to request a copy of virtual video that they did for Veterans Day. The video included the interviews of five Post members.

To end, my sincere wishes to all our Legion Family for a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. I offer my prayers for the continued health and safety of us all.





#### American Legion Auxiliary Rose-Harms Unit 355 Newsletter – January 2021

As I begin composing this JANUARY newsletter, the date is actually December 20th. The Holidays are upon us and they'll certainly be different than any we've ever seen. Due to circumstances, our monthly Unit meeting scheduled for December 15th was cancelled.

As reported in our December newsletter, our Unit is taking on a project to collect cleaning items to make up Buddy Baskets, to be given to the Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative (MHVI). The baskets are given to Veterans who are moving into new housing. Below is a list of items needed to fill the baskets:

All-purpose cleaners

Bleach wipes (Lysol, Clorox, etc.)

Window/Glass cleaner

Paper towels

Cleanser (such as Comet, etc.)

**Broom** 

**Dust Mop** 

Bucket

Floor (scrub) mop

Floor cleaner

Sponges

Dish soap

Fabric sheets

Toilet bowl cleaner

Toilet bowl brush

Furniture Polish (such as Pledge, etc.)

Toilet paper

The MHVI has informed us that donations are down this year due to COVID, that their supply of these items is extremely low, and that they'll use whatever we can send. NOTE: THEY'RE ESPE-CIALLY IN NEED OF BLEACH WIPES (LYSOL, CLOROX, ETC). Donations of ANY of these items (no donation is too small), or cash to purchase items, would be greatly appreciated. Baskets will be delivered by the end of the month, so items should be brought to the January meeting. Don't forget to keep track of the approximate cost of your donation so that it can be noted on the sign-in sheet at the meeting, as well as on your Member Tracking Worksheet. These details are used for the final Unit project report. # 2021 MIDWINTER CONFERENCE

The Department Convention & Activities Commission met on Thursday, December 17, 2020, and The Department Executive Committee (DEC) met Friday, evening to discuss the Midwinter Conference. The DEC passed a resolution with the following resolve clauses:

RESOLVED, By the Department Executive Committee of The American Legion, Department of Wisconsin that due to the continued spread of COVID-19 in Wisconsin, the numerous related recommendations, and concern for the safety of all members of the American Legion Family, The American Legion, Department of Wisconsin Department Executive Committee agrees that present circumstances constitute sufficient reasons to postpone all training sessions and activities, and in-person Department meetings scheduled for the 2021 Midwinter Conference until May 6, 7, 8 and 9, 2021, in conjunction with the Department Spring Meetings;

and, be it further RESOLVED, That all business meetings of committees, commissions, and Department Executive Committee, regularly held at the Midwinter Conference shall be held as virtual meetings instead of in-person. <u>Full Resolution</u>

This means that the training, Association meetings, banquet, luncheons and social events that were to be held January 14-17, 2021 will now be held May 6-9, 2021 at Ho-Chunk Gaming Wisconsin Dells. (The Wisconsin American Legion College is discussing the possibility of holding some of the courses virtual in January and then in person again in May. This will be posted on wilegion.org)

The second resolve clause means that the Department Committee & Commission meetings, along with the Department Executive Committee meeting, that were to be held in January 14-17, 2021 will now be held virtual. All of those called in to a meeting will be emailed the virtual schedule as soon as it is completed.

If you have reservations, and have registered for any parts of the conference, you will have the following choices:

- 1. Transfer everything to the May Conference
- 2. Donate the money to the Programs

Request a refund

If you choose 2 or 3, make sure to let us know if you had a room reservation so that we can cancel that also. We will be reaching out to everyone in the coming weeks. Please share this information with your Post, County and District.

Please also allow the Headquarters team time to update the website and all forms accordingly.
