

Living Well—10 Ways to Reduce Stress. From the on-going pandemic, stress is taking its toll. Nearly half of Americans believe their stress has increased over the past 5years. Connection between stress and physical health is real. Here are some tips: Exercise regularly. Studies show that those who do experience lower levels of anxiety and depression. Get some rest. Meditation and patterned breathing help improve sleep. Focus on antioxidants in your diet such as pecans, beans, beets, berries, artichokes, kale, and spinach. Cut caffeine (coffee & energy drinks). High doses of stimulant can lead to anxiety. Swap that extra cup of coffee for a green tea. Start a hobby. Try aromatherapy. Start a journal. Putting your thoughts in writing. Laughing can improve immune function. Just say no. Too many activities don't allow yourself to focus on priorities.

Toxic Exposure & Burn Pits

A disturbingly high percentage of post-9/11 veterans have been exposed to airborne toxic hazards, often the result of personal proximity to burn pits for extended times during service. The American Legion has fought for service-connected disability benefits for conditions linked to toxic exposures for decades and will continue to do so for this generation. The American Legion urges Congress to reintroduce and pass the Toxic Exposure in the American Military (TEAM) Act of 2020.

Last week, a VA advisory committee heard from researchers on several promising treatments for Gulf War Illness (GWI). Several therapies are showing promising effectiveness during clinical trials. One that would be immediately accessible to large numbers of veterans is diet-based. A low glutamate diet has been shown to dramatically reduce the symptoms of GWI. Some trial participants complain that their diet becomes highly restrictive. Others are willing to deal with that in exchange for alleviation of symptoms. In initial clinical tests, 73% of people were considered to have improved after one month on the special diet.

During the meeting, the committee chair stressed the importance of people having enough vitamin D, and encouraged veterans to take D3 supplements. Dr. Lawrence Steinman added that people with more melanin in their skin (e.g., darker skin color) will routinely have lower levels of this vitamin, which is important for boosting the immune system.

The American Legion's second annual 100 Miles for Hope has been expanded for 2021. There are two ways to register and participate. In order to allow participants to track their activities and encourage others to fundraise, we are using an app from a company called Kilter. Here's how to get started:

- 1) <u>Register</u> via Kilter and join our activity challenge, donate and fundraise for The American Legion. Every participant receives a medal to celebrate their achievement. It's easy and takes less than a minute.
- 2) Download the free Kilter app in the app store
- 3) Choose Sign In (top right)
- 4) Go to the Events tab > My Events (100 Miles For Hope will automatically come up as you've already registered!)
- 5) Complete your profile and connect your devices. Don't forget to set a goal!
- 6) Share! Tell all your family members and friends you're participating in The American Legion's 100 Miles for Hope that raises funds to support veterans and military families. Share <u>your story on Legiontown</u>, post to social media and send e-mails.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Complete daily wellness activities of at least a half-hour and accumulate points. You can complete up to
three wellness activities each day that count toward your total. There are more than 40 different activities to choose from. And if your activity isn't represented on the app, you can create a manual
activity that will count. Also, there are ways to receive bonus points! Check the app to find out
how.

from our current Legion Members.


SAL Clothing: Contact Brian Hadler @ 262-894-7465 let Brian know if anyone needs anything.
