Members made dementia quilts: Dementia quilts are also known as Fidget blankets. It is a quilt that has several different objects on it that stimulate dementia individuals with activities and sensory items to encourage mental and physical activity. They may also help reduce emotional escalation and boredom.

As a unit we donated over 900 hours, spent approximately \$22,049.00, served approximately 477 Veterans and their families and received around \$7,400.00 in in-kind donations. And this is just a small summery of what our Auxiliary has accomplished during the worst pandemic most of us have seen during our life time!

We tried to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the American Legion Auxiliary in the community with a party and when that couldn't happen we found other ways to let our community know who we are and what we do! Our Rose-Harms Unit also hit a milestone during the pandemic as we too turned 75. Well we're 76 now and like many others we missed that milestone with a party, but as I mentioned above we have lots to be proud of. I want to offer special recognition to my good friend Arline Kaul. Her parents were both charter members of our Rose-Harms American Legion Family. Arline once told me that she was young when her parents helped start Rose-Harms and didn't join right away like all young gals at the time! She did however join the following year and Arline has been a member of our Auxiliary for 75 years!!! Thank you Arline for being someone that I have counted on many times over the past years as a mentor!

I must say that these last 2 years have been a real wild ride for both myself and our Auxiliary! We were met with some real adversities that as a whole, we overcame! Ozaukee County War Memorial Program and Rededication

Friday May 28, 2021 at 5pm 1201 S. Spring Street, Port Washington

Extensive renovations were completed in 2019 which involved removing the deteriorating brick perimeter and concrete. The Memorial was redone in granite and the concrete was replaced. When the original War Memorial was built in 1991, three soldiers from Ozaukee County were not included on the original granite monuments and one airman's name was not accurate when engraved. The following corrections were made:



WWI

Private Joseph B. Notting of Port Washington fought with the 32nd Division and was killed in action at Chateau Thierry in France on July 31, 1918. He is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Port Washington.

Private Jacob Risch of Belgium served with the 4th Infantry Division in France and died on October 25, 1918 of wounds received in battle in the Argonne two weeks before. He is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Lake Church.

WWII

Sergeant Frank Roeckl of Saukville was killed in action near Mount Kammerer, Italy on December 6, 1943 while fighting with the 40th Infantry Division in a push toward Monte Cassino. His remains were never found and he is memorialized on the Tablets of the Missing in the Sicily-Rome American Cemetery at Nettuno, Italy. His niece Marilyn Meyer and his nephew Jerome Roeckl are planning on attending the ceremony.

The name of **First Lieutenant Paul G. Wiening** was not properly engraved on the original monument. Lieutenant Wiening was the co-pilot of a C-47 carrying paratroopers from the 82nd Airborne into Holland during Operation Market Garden on September 17, 1944. He was shot down and died near the border of Holland and Germany. His remains are interred in the Netherlands American Cemetery at Margraten. His granddaughter Toni Krick is planning on attending the ceremony. Lieutenant Wiening's wife was pregnant with Toni's father when he gave his life for his country.

Please join the Ozaukee County Council American Legion, Ozaukee County American Legion Auxiliary, and Veterans of Foreign Wars as we honor the fallen at the Ozaukee County War Memorial on Friday May 28th at 5pm.
