#### Highlights from our Last Meeting

**Blood Drive:** Mike Knoppa—The Post's Blood Drive scheduled for December 1st has ben cancelled by the Blood Center.

**Americanism:** Commander Ken reported that the Badger Boys State program is scheduled for the 12th through the 22nd of June at UW Eau Claire. Usually, Juniors are only eligible, but this year only, Seniors are also eligible candidates. Interviews will be conducted in Spring. The Post, the Lions Club and the VFW will each sponsor a one student.

Living Well-----Pneumonia can develop when viruses or bacteria enter the respiratory tract, either from breathing in particles or touching contaminated surfaces. The most common cause is the influenza virus, but Covid infections can also lead to pneumonia. Once infected, lungs become inflamed and fill with fluid so less oxygen gets into the bloodstream. Coughing, chest pain, difficulty breathing, fever, chills, and fatigue results. Most at risk are adults over 65, smokers, and those with impaired immunity. Pneumonia can be deadly. Seek treatment if you have symptoms. If you haven't as yet, get vaccinated for both Influenza and Covid.
