The Post donated pier was purchased and has been installed and is looking great. The Post's cabin has been taking on water because of a tree branch falling on roof. After many misses a repair or new roof seems to be in the works.

Recommendations Passed:

Due to the passing of Dan Harris, the checking account for the Post's AL Baseball team which was used for paying bills needed addressing. A motion from the floor was tendered and passed unanimously to remove Dan's name

from the account and replace it with the Post Finance Officer, Ralph Beck's name and team manager/coach Brian Durst.

The Post will donate \$500 towards the State Commander's IROC Motorcycle Run. The Run will benefit the Highground Veterans Memorial in Neillsville, Wisconsin. Funds raised will be used to construct a new Visitors Center to better help Veterans, many of whom get personalized support services as they visit, tour, and come to know The Highground.

BADGER BOYS STATE----JUNE 12-18.


