PACT ACT IMPLEMENTATION

A subcommittee of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, on Tuesday, learned that, as of May 12, 251,584 veterans and family members had completed PACT Act claims, with an 80% approval rate. Lawmakers expressed concern over the growing backlog in claims. VA witnesses said that was expected, and they are working to deal with it. This year, they have processed 15% more claims than they had at this time last year, despite receiving 30% more claims. The VA continues to hire more employees, train them, and impose mandatory overtime (although a respite will be provided for several weeks during the summer).

On April 17, they completed more than 9,000 claims decisions in a day, the highest level in VA his-

tory. They have completed more than 8,000 claims in a day more than 40 times this year, something that had occurred only six times before this year. The VA intends to publish a list of about 300 potential service presumptions related to toxic exposures in the next few months. VA officials say this is the first time they will have the opportunity to receive public input in this manner, thanks to the PACT Act.
